




Sample of work







Feedback:

Flowchart/work plan

This is a plan of what I intend to do each week.

Week 1	On the first week I made a full size paper cut out of my t-shirt and sketched my design onto it. I also decided on the design that I was going to make. I drew out two different design choices and chose one of them as my design. I chose my first idea which was to make a t-shirt with a polar bear in the center.
Week 2	On the second week I sketched my design onto my t-shirt using Taylors chalk. Then I stitched the heart and the P.O.L.A.R and the B using a pink and a purple thread. I did all this in backstitch.
Week 3	On the third week I started to cut out the felt for the background. I stuck on the felt using bond-web. I also stitched the E.A and R in pink embroidery thread. (In backstitch).
Week 4	On the forth week I stitched the outside of the background fabric using an invisible stitch and two different colours of blue thread. I also stitched the S in pink embroidery thread. (In backstitch).

Week 5	On the fifth week sketched the outline of the polar bear onto the felt using tailors chalk. I then stitched the outside of the polar bear using white thred. Finally I stitched on the felt ice-burgs using an invisible stich.
Week 6	On the sixth week I went around the outline of the polar bear using sequins and white thred.
Week 7	I started writing up every thing that I had done. I did page 5-15 in my folder. I also fixed some stiches on my t-shirt. I started my care table.
Week 8	On the eighth week I did page 16-24 in my folder I finished my care table, I fixed some stiches on my t-shirt and I ironed my t-shirt. Finally I handed in my project to my teacher.

Feedback:

The ~~stitches~~ on the writing 1. POLAR and BEARS are loose and coming out at the ends. The outline of the polar bear was good but it could be more defined. ~~It's~~ The polar bear should have a face to make it more clear that it is a polar bear.

Student reflection:

I think that this was very good feedback so I decided that I would fix the stitches. I also decided that I would outline the polar bear in sequins to make it more defined. I also decided that I would give the polar bear a neck-line, eyes and a snout to make it seem like it was a polar bear.

Textile Care and Maintenance


My t-shirt (Background) is 100% cotton fabric. My textile fabrics are 100% polyester fiber made from recycled plastic bottles. I recommend ~~wash~~ dry cleaning this item because the dark blue fabric runs and may change the white t-shirt blue. I also recommend this because there is hand embroidery an sequins stitched onto this item.

If my item got stained I would recommend that it should be spot cleaned using Bio detergent and a damp cloth.

If ~~you're~~ ironing it I would recommend that you should either place a fabric over the center of the t-shirt where the felt and sequins are, or turn the t-shirt inside out and iron on a low temperature.

I would not recommend tumble drying this item as it could harm the stiffness or the sequins.

This item can not be bleached, as it will effect the fabrics the embroidery and the t-shirt.

Evaluate your textile item under the following headings:

• Quality of the finished item

The quality of my item is quite good. My stitches around the writing is good ~~the~~ heart is one of my favourite parts of ~~the~~ my design because not fraying. I also like the felt because the sides are staying down very well. To make sure the fabric stayed down I ~~had to~~ used bond-web to stick it down but it started to lift at the edges to fix this I had to do a whipped stitch around the edges. The sequins were the most challenging because it was very hard to get them to stick down.

• Creativity and design

I think ~~the~~ creativity of my design is very good because I thought of this design myself. I got my inspiration from everyone talking about climate change and how it is making the ice caps melting. Because of that polar bears are dying. I decided to make just an outline of a polar bear and just a few ice-burbs to show where the polar bear was before the ice-burbs melted and it could no longer survive.


• Textile skills

I think my skill were good apart from when I was stitching on the sequins. At first I was doing a single stitch for each sequin but at the end I started to two stitches for each sequin. This was better because the sequins started to stay down better. I think my fabric cutting and stitching of the fabric was quite good as there were no edge bits on my circle of fabrics and no lifting off the sides.

2. A reflection on what went well and challenges encountered during the design brief process



Reflect on your experience of the design brief process under the following headings:

- Does your finished textile item meet the design brief? (Explain why or why not)

I think my design meets the design brief because I made a textile item using fabric, sequins and embroidery thread to make a design on a t-shirt that I am going to give to a family member. I also thought of this idea by myself to try get a message out about climate change. I used an old t-shirt and sequins I already had at home to make my design sustainable. I used different stitches to make my design to make a good quality design. I also designed a care label recommending ~~the~~ how to wash my item. My work was completed & handed up within 8 weeks.

- What went well during the design brief process?

I think most of my design went well because I considered all of the relevant factors that I would need to be able to complete my design. When I got my feedback there was lots of very helpful ideas on how I could make my design better which in the end worked out really well and definitely made my design look better. My favourite part of my design was the fabric in the background because it looked very good and it was staying down very well at the edges.

- What areas did you find a challenging during the design brief process?

I found it hard to show my idea to other people as I was really proud of my idea and I did not want anyone to criticise it. But I showed my idea to other people after I were very supportive of other people after good ideas that I had had some very my design and think helped very at the end so I think better nothing to worry about.

- What new skills have you learned working through the design brief process?

I learned how to stick on sequins properly as I had never done that before. At first I did not know how + ~~wanted to do this~~ to do this stitch on the sequins and I started of only using one ~~for~~ stitch for each sequin but after a while I found that if I used two stitches down better.

3. Conclusions

- If I was to go through the design brief process again what would I do differently?

I would consider all the relevant factors again because I did not really understand at the start how ~~I would do~~ to do it. I would also try to think of a design more quickly as I did not have as much time to do the sewing because I spent too much time thinking of my idea.

- If I was to make a textile item again what would I do differently?

I would not include too much detail as I found that the more detail there was the harder and longer it was to do. ~~I would also~~ if I was doing sequins again I would use the double stitch instead of the single stitch as ~~it~~ they stuck down better when I used the double stitch.



Teacher feedback

- FOQ 1** The design brief process is completed to an acceptable standard. The investigation of possible solutions requires further analysis. The principles of design are evident in the item. There is scope to include them in the written evidence. Sustainability is evident and applied to a high standard. Reasons for choice need to be developed (link to sustainability and principles of design).
- FOQ 2** The felt is securely attached. The stitch tension on the wording is very loose. The stitches on the bear outline are a little long. Take care starting and finishing to avoid puckering for example on the 'B' for Bears. The design demonstrates a good level of creativity and originality.

- FOQ 3** Reflection demonstrates some ability to evaluate both the product and the design brief process. Accurate points one the application of the sequins and the benefit of peer feedback. The evaluation of some of the stitches is not accurate e.g. "around the writing is good". Good evidence of reflection throughout the design brief process.
